



Primary School Sport Premium Report Wheelers Lane Primary School 2015 - 2016

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing £150 million in additional funding per annum until 2020 for primary schools in the UK. The funding is ringfenced and can only be spent on sport and PE provision. Schools are required to demonstrate how they have used the funding to deliver additional resources which will promote participation, progress and attainment in PE.

The school is required to publish information on the school website about how the grant has been used and the impact it had.

How much Sport Premium income has the school received?

Each school receives a lump sum of £8,000 per annum plus £5 per pupil on roll. Wheelers Lane Primary School received a total of £10,700 for the academic year 2015/16.

How has the school used the funding?

Bishop Challoner Sports Partnership

We have used our Sports Funding to work alongside our highly effective local Sports Partnership. The Partnership's specialist PE teachers have delivered twilight sessions to our staff on how to deliver high quality PE sessions and use the core tasks to effectively assess attainment and progress.

Our Sports Partnership also offers a range of 'inter' and 'intra' sports competition to ignite passion and enthusiasm across a range of sports that the children may not have had the opportunity to try before. These sports include:

- Football Tournaments and League Matches
- Basketball Tournaments
- Netball Tournaments and League Matches
- Swimming Competitions
- Gymnastics Competition - represent the Sports Partnership at the Winter Games
- Cricket Coaching and Tournaments
- Cross Country - weekly events
- Sports Hall Athletics
- Rounders Competitions

- **Multi-Skills Activities (KS1)**

Our Sports Partnership also offer a range of extensive professional development courses. We have sent our teachers on courses including gymnastics, dance and athletics. Our teachers have implemented new strategies within their year group, supporting the professional development of other members of staff.

Our Sports Partnership are responsible for training our Year 6 'Playground Leaders'. The children are involved in a training programme and were timetabled to deliver daily structured sporting activities for children across KS2, offering extended day sports provision.

PE specialists from Wheelers Lane Technology College

We have also invested in the facilities and PE specialists at our local outstanding secondary school. PE teachers carry out weekly PE sessions with all of the children in Year 3, working alongside our teachers to support their professional development in order for them to have a clear understanding of what outstanding teaching looks like in PE.

In addition, all of the children in Year 5 have the use of their state-of-the-art Sports Hall facilities. Sessions are delivered by both our teachers and the school's PE specialist teachers.

Wheelers Lane Technology College offers the opportunity for boys in Year 5/6 to attend a gifted and talented weekly sports club.

We also run half-termly training sessions for our footballers in upper Key Stage Two.

Sports Plus Scheme

In addition to the core day, we have used our Funding to employ specialist coaches to deliver lunchtime and after-school sessions in a range of sports. (Degree or Level2/3 NGB Qualified). Our coaches are trained extensively and are equipped to deliver clubs covering a variety of sports.

Throughout the year, our coach has worked with a number of year groups supporting the delivery of High Quality PE sessions alongside our teachers.

Impact on Participation and Attainment

The Sports Premium has enabled Wheelers Lane Primary School to invest more heavily in a focused teaching resource. Our teachers now have the opportunity to work alongside PE specialist teachers and coaches, along with access to professional development courses and school Insets centred around PE. As a result, teachers are now more confident about delivering PE sessions (7.4 out of 10) and assessing children using the core task assessments (7.1 out of 10) which were introduced by our Sports Partnership. These confidence ratings are an improvement from the previous year and the PE Coordinator is working alongside new members of staff and those with less confidence.

Thanks to the Sports Premium, children in Years 1-6 have all taken part in 'intra' sports competition. Every child in KS1 has taken part in 'inter' sports competition and every child in KS2 has been invited to take part in 'inter' sports competition. With the introduction of the Sports Scheme Plus coaching company, every child will have an opportunity to join a lunchtime or after school club. Every child in KS2 has access to a lunchtime club led by a trained play leader.

Our involvement in the Sports Partnership means that children at Wheelers Lane have the opportunity to compete in a wide variety of competitive sporting activities as listed above.

In a recent questionnaire, 97% of our children were willing to take part in weekly PE lessons and 94% of our children are confident in their ability to perform. This is an improvement from previous years.

Attainment at Wheelers Lane Primary School is accelerating every year. The core task assessments have revealed that 88% of our pupils are making the expected progress in gymnastics and 91.7% are expected for games. 26.1% of our children are above the expected level in gymnastics and 39% of our children are above expected in games.
