## Imperative verbs

**Verbs** are words which describe an **action**, **occurrence** or **state**. For example- the ice cream is **melting**. The snowman **wears** a hat.

**Imperative verbs** are sometimes known as **bossy** verbs. They are verbs which **tell you what to do**. They are often seen at the beginning of a sentence and create a **command**.

## Examples

Eat your lunch.
Tidy the cloakroom.
Write today's date.
Walk home after school

Go outside to play.

Ask your dad what he thinks.

Kick the ball into the goal.

Surprise your friend to cheer them up.
