1. School Trips

1.1 During school hours:

The cost of all school trips and visits will reflect only the actual cost of the travel, admission charges where appropriate and insurance. Parents/carers will be asked to make voluntary contributions in respect of the costs outlined above. However, no child will be excluded from the activity on the basis of a parent/carer to make a contribution. If insufficient contributions are received toward the cost of an activity, then the school reserves the right not to proceed.

1.2 Outside school hours:

If a parent agrees to their child taking part in extended or extra-curricular activities, they will be obliged to pay all the cost. Parents/carers must also pay all the costs of a school organised residential visit.

2. Practical Issues

- 2.1 No charge will be made for basic materials or ingredients needed for practical subjects.
- 2.2 On the occasions when children take home the finished product, parents may be asked to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost.

3. School Visits for the enrichment of the Curriculum

- 3.1 A letter will be sent to parents asking for voluntary contributions to cover transport costs, insurance and entrance fees.
- 3.2 Parents will be informed that there is no obligation to make a contribution and that pupils whose parent/carer does not make a contribution will not be excluded from the trip.
- 3.3 A particular visit or activity may not take place if the total contributions are less than 2/3 of the total cost.

4. Music Lessons

- 4.1 A charge will be made for those receiving peripatetic music lessons. At present the cost is £7.50 per lesson.
- 4.2 Musical instruments are provided by the music service.

5. Visiting Entertainers and Drama Companies

5.1 A letter will be sent to parents, asking for a voluntary contribution to cover some of the cost. The residue will be met either from the school budget share or school fund. No child will be excluded if a contribution is not made.
